SCHOOL OPENING:

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 6th
HOMEROOM CLASS AT 10:00AM!

Students entering Grades 8-12 (ESL 8-12, Learning Support Program and Pacific Storm Program students) are to report to their homeroom/registration class at 10:00AM. Homeroom class lists will be posted in the skywalk.

Completion of registration procedures will take place at this time and timetables will be distributed. Payment of general school fees will take place Tuesday, September 6th to Thursday, September 8th in homeroom/registration classes.

New Britannia students who have pre-registered in Grades 8 - 12 should report to their homeroom class at 10:00 AM on Tuesday, September 6th.

Students who have not yet registered should report to the Main Office to make an appointment to register.

Students who do not report on the first day of school, September 6th, and who do not notify their counsellor that they will be returning, will lose their priority in choice of courses.

ASSEMBLIES

The following grade assemblies will take place the first week of school in the Historic Britannia Auditorium:

RESPECT

All Britannia community members - staff, students, volunteers, visitors, and parents - shall RESPECT one another and the environment we share.

ACADEMIC HONESTY

We at Britannia feel that all of our partners - administrators, teachers, parents and students - share in the responsibility for academic honesty. To help students pursue their studies in an honest and profitable manner, the following policy has been put in place:

Academic dishonesty is defined as: Any attempt by a student to complete an examination or assessment by unfair means. Unfair means may include any one or more of the following:

1. Plagiarism - "Plagiarism is a serious academic offence. It is intellectual theft. Any use of another's research, ideas, or language without proper attribution may be considered plagiarism." (Gordon, S.D., p.1).
2. Obtaining or providing unauthorized information during an examination through verbal, visual, or unauthorized use of books, notes, text, or electronic devices.
3. Obtaining or providing information concerning all or part of an examination prior to the examination.
4. Taking an examination for another student, arranging for another person to take an exam in one's place.
5. Altering or changing test answers after submission for grading, altering or changing grades after grades have been awarded, or altering or changing other academic records.
6. Making any other attempt to improve grades using means that have not been or would not be approved by your teacher.

Consequences for Academic Dishonesty:

After a complete investigation of the situation and in consultation with the appropriate grade administrator, the teacher will contact the parent to inform them of one or more of the following consequences:

1. The student will receive a "0" for the work.
2. The incident will be recorded and placed in a central file.
3. The incident may be recorded in the student's file.
4. The student may not be eligible for honour roll.
5. The student may not be eligible for a reference letter from staff.
6. The student may not be eligible for school scholarships.
7. Students in Venture or IB may not be allowed to continue in the program.

VANCOUVER SCHOOL BOARD POLICIES

ALCOHOL & DRUGS

The Vancouver School Board has a policy which states that students who have consumed or are in possession of drugs and/or alcohol at school functions are subject to disciplinary action which can include suspension, transfer or dismissal from school.

RACE RELATIONS

The Vancouver School Board condemns and opposes any expression of racial/ethnic prejudice within the school system. There is a well-defined procedure for resolving any unjust behavior shown against people because of their ethnic origin, language, colour, race or religion. This policy applies to all employees as well as students. Students or staff who believe they have been subjected to racial or ethnic prejudices should report the incident to the school Administration immediately.

VIOLENCE

"Violence is characterized by verbal or written threats; physical, emotional, sexual abuse or harassment; or racial harassment by an individual or group of individuals."

Students, parents or guardians and employees should be advised that the Vancouver School Board shall not tolerate violence of any kind in the premises, on its property or during any school sanctioned activity.

Any behaviour or actions deemed to be within the above definition must be reported to the Administration. Persons involved in such incidents will be subjected to disciplinary action. The Administration may call the Vancouver Police Department for assistance.

WEAPONS

"Weapons" are defined as any objects that can be used to threaten or harm another person. Severe disciplinary action will be taken against any student who possesses or threatens to use anything that can be construed as a weapon.

Possession, threatening or use of weapons can lead not only to transfer, suspension or expulsion from school, but also to the laying of criminal charges.



NON-SMOKING

Vancouver School Board has a smoke free policy. Smoking is not permitted in any school building or grounds. This policy is enforced by all school personnel.

In conclusion, we want you to know that our schools are safe places where interference to student learning is not tolerated. We intend to keep it that way. There is no need for alarm on your part, but we feel it is important to keep you informed about the measures we are taking to ensure the safety of your children.



LOCKERS

This year lockers have been reserved for students in Grades 8, 9, 10 and 11. These will be assigned by first period class teachers.

A bank of lockers is available for Grade 12's on the third floor adjacent to and across from Rooms 302, 303, 304, 305 and 306. Grade 12's can select a locker. The fee to select a locker is \$5 and you can choose your locker on Tuesday, September 06th, Wednesday, September 07th or Thursday, September 9th (first come, first served) at 8:30am.

Please note that neither the school nor the Vancouver School Board has insurance to cover loss by theft or damage of personal property of students or staff. Although supervision by staff and the cooperation of students minimize the possibility of theft, students are advised to leave valuables at home and to ensure that personal property left in the school is covered by their own insurance.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES POLICY

Students are requested to make sure that cell phones, iPods etc. are turned off and kept out of sight during class time. We appreciate that parents/guardians want their children to have cell phones for safety reasons. However, given the sophistication of technology available to students, it is requested that during any exam in class that

students not bring any electronic device to the exam. Teachers will inform students which type of calculator is permissible during math and science tests/exams.

SCHOOL PHOTOS

Student photographs will be taken on Friday, September 23rd. Students should make every effort to be present that day. Students will be issued Student Photo Identification Cards to replace the 2015-2016 school year issue. The photo card is required for identification at various school events and facilities including bus passes.

Students who wish to purchase one of the photograph packages must have the correct change or a cheque made payable to The Artona Group Inc. Order envelopes will be available during the first couple of weeks of September.

LUNCH PROGRAM

The Vancouver School Board and Britannia Secondary are pleased to offer a subsidized lunch program at our school. All students are eligible for this program.

The cost of the program varies each month as it is based on the number of days school is in session. If you wish your son or daughter to receive lunches for the month, a registration form is enclosed and will also be handed out with contribution envelopes the first week of school for September. However, we appreciate if parents could apply ahead of time so that we can coordinate with cafeteria staff. Lunchsmart Registration forms and contribution envelopes are also available from the main office for October to June. BUS PASSES

Bus passes are only assigned to District or Alternative Programs, not including IB or Venture. Any student requesting transportation assistance must live over 4.8kms from Britannia.
